Ever wanted to see what changed in your Sitefinity database when you upgraded to a new version of Sitefinity. This tool allows you to select the version you are upgrading from and the version of Sitefinity you are upgrading to, then it will show you a chart of all the database changes.

7. SITEFINITY CMS AND .NET FRAMEWORK COMPATIBILITY

Visual Studio Extensions

The first set of software tools that I recommend installing are a few Visual Studio extensions that will help you with your development process. Some of these extensions are specific for Visual Studio 2017 and Visual Studio 2019.

13 SITEFINITY VSIX

At the time of writing this content the Sitefinity VSIX works only on Visual Studio 2015 and Visual Studio 2017. Support for Visual Studio 2019 should be coming soon. This extension replaces the Sitefinity Thunder extension, but only provides the ability to work with the newer MVC components. This includes MVC Packages, MVC Templates, MVC Grid Templates, and MVC Widgets.

An older Sitefinity extension, I recommend using it only if you are building the older web forms components for Sitefinity or you are using Visual Studio 2015 and older.

15 GITHUB EXTENSION FOR VISUAL STUDIO

It's always a good idea to put your source code into source control. GitHub is FREE for all public and private repositories and Visual Studio makes it easy with the GitHub Extension for Visual Studio.

17. VISUAL STUDIO DEV ESSENTIALS

If you can't afford an MSDN subscription, that's fine, Microsoft provides developer tooling for those on a shoe string budget with Visual Studio Dev Essentials. This FREE subscription gives you access to Visual Studio Community Edition and access to SQL Server Developer Edition. I recommend you have these both installed on your dev machine.

18. SQL SERVER MANAGEMENT STUDIO (SSMS)

If you're working with SQL Server databases or Azure SQL Databases with your Sitefinity projects, then SQL Server Management Studio is a must. Download and install.

19. JUST DECOMPILE

Every wonder how that Sitefinity code was built? Just Decompile allows you to open a .NET assembly (.dll) and view the disassembled C# or VB code. Even convert a .NET assembly back into a Visual Studio project.

Ever wanted to compare the code of two .NET assemblies? Now you can with Just Assembly. Just select two different versions of the same assembly and compare. Simple but awesome.

21. POSTMAN

If your solution uses REST service endpoints, then get Postman. It makes it easy to view and try out REST endpoints before trying to implement them in your own code.

22. FIDDLER

Need to do some deep inspection of your HTTP Requests and Responses? Fiddler allows you to get deep insights on your HTTP communication.

23. LOCK HUNTER

Ever try copying a newer version of a file over an older version only to find out the file is locked? With Lock Hunter, just right and select "What is locking this file?". Then remove the file lock and your good to go.

24. BEYOND COMPARE

The best file comparison tool ever. This tool does code a few bucks, but it is well worth it. Compare files, folders, Excel spreadsheets, Word documents, pictures, you name it, Beyond Compare can tell you exactly what is different. It even allows you to compare from UNC paths and FTP directories.
